# UG Students Feedback 2021-22

The overall undergraduate students' feedback was collected from each department of the Voorhees College Vellore. The total respondents of the feedback were 1011. Among the respondents, Shift I constitute 55.3% and Shift II constitutes 44.7%. Nearly 22 questions were framed and the data was collected through the online link. The questionnaire was framed on the basis of 5-point Rating scale. A high response denotes "Excellent" and a low response denotes "Poor". Among the total respondents 81.6% are male and 18.4 % are female.

Around 46% of the total respondents had said "Good", 23.2% of the respondents had said "Very Good" and 19 % said "Excellent" for the syllabus covered in the class. In regard to the understanding of the subject taught by the teacher, 45.8% has said Good, 28.7% said Very good and 15.8% has said excellent.

Majority of the respondents that is around 44.5% and 43.4% had expressed "Good" for the internal evaluation process through online teaching methods in social media classrooms. Similarly, 43.4% and 45.3% had agreed "Good" for the student-teacher interaction and doubts cleared during the online class, 24.6% and 23.7% had said "Very Good" for the above feedback.

Nearly 43.3% had said "Good", 27.4% had said "Very Good" and 18.3 % had expressed "Excellent" for the process of online assignment submissions. Regarding to the discussion of performance in assignments question, 46.9% agreed "Good", 23.5% said "Very Good" and 18.8 % had said "Excellent".

Nearly 44% said "Good", 23% said "Very Good" and 17.6% said "Excellent" to the feedback of institution takes an active interest in promoting internship, and student field visit opportunities. 46.6% of the respondents said "Good", 23.1% said "Very Good" and 17.6 % said "Excellent" for the teaching and monitoring process in institutions' cognitive, social & emotional growth.

The overall post-graduate students' feedback was collected from each department of the Voorhees College Vellore. The total respondents of the feedback were 378. Among the respondents, Shift I constitute 44.5% and Shift II constitutes 55.5%. Nearly 22 questions were framed and the data was collected through the online link. The questionnaire was framed on the basis of 5-point Rating scale. A high response denotes "Excellent" and a low response denotes "Poor". Among the total respondents, 62% are male and 38 % were female.

Around 47.8% of the total respondents had said "Good", 25.7% of the respondents had said "Very Good" and 19.8 % said "Excellent" for the syllabus covered in the class. In regard to the understanding of the subject taught by the teacher, 43.7% has said Good, 29.9% said Very good and 20.1% has said excellent.

The majority of the respondents that is around 41% and 40.3% had expressed "Good" for the internal evaluation process through online teaching methods in social media classrooms. Similarly, 44.4% and 44.8% had agreed "Good" for the student-teacher interaction and doubts cleared during the online class, 26.1% and 25.4% had said "Very Good" for the above feedback.

Around 45.7 % of the total respondents expressed Agree, 30.4 % have expressed Strongly Agree, 21.7% had said Neutral and 2 % had said Disagree for the syllabus designed to bridge the gap between theory and practical.

About the syllabus designed to bridge the gap between academics and industry, nearly 45.7 % of the total respondents expressed Agree, 30.4 % have expressed Strongly Agree, 23.9 % had said Neutral and 6.5% had said Disagree

Nearly 45.7 % of the total respondents expressed Agree, 30.4 % have expressed Strongly Agree, 21.7 % had said Neutral and 2.2% had said Disagree for the syllabus designed in a way to improve employability index.


















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#### ALUMNI FEEDBACK 2021-2022
